Up Coming and On Going Activities

Here Comes the Campout!

One of the favorite annual activities at the Colton church is the combined summer Campout with the Fontana SDA Church. Our Campout will take place on

the weekend of Friday, July 29 through Sunday, July 31. This year we are getting together at Table Mountain Campground, located at an elevation of 7200 ft in the Angeles National Forest, about 10 minutes beyond Wrightwood, very near the Mountain High Ski Area. Perched atop a forested mountain with a commanding view of the Mojave Desert below, this campground is accessible entirely on paved roads, and offers an expanded array of basic amenities. In addition to having reserved what should be more than sufficient camping space, the two churches have also reserved the campground's amphitheater for Saturday, which will allow enough parking space for all those who wish to enjoy the mountain experience for the daylight hours of the Sabbath only.

As in past years, there will sundown vespers services on Friday and Saturday evenings; a complete Sabbath School and Divine Service/Worship Service in the open air on Sabbath, Saturday, July 30; fellowship potluck lunch after church service on Sabbath; crafts for children, and a nature hike for adults, on Sabbath afternoon; and time for conversation and fellowship around the campfire after dark. Meals will be provided by the churches for dinner on Friday and Saturday, and for breakfast on Saturday and Sunday. Any special dietary needs (vegan, etc) need to be reported to Art Bell well in advance of the Campout weekend. Since

one of the main reasons people go camping is to get away from the bustle and noise of city life, special care will be taken this year to allow for quiet

enjoyment of the natural surroundings by all attendees, including a "Very Quiet Zone" for those who are looking for extra peace and quiet.

One thing that Table Mountain does not offer is abundant parking space for those camping overnight, which is why pricing for attendees has been adjusted this year to encourage carpooling by campers. Any overnight campers who come up in a vehicle with at least three other campers (excluding those who come in a towed RV, which takes up two spaces), or who are dropped off at the campout by a driver who is not staying overnight, will be charged only \$13 for the weekend, while all others will be charged \$18. (Children ages 4 and under camp for free.) Those who are just coming up for the day on Sabbath the 30th need to pay only \$5 per vehicle (no per-person charge). This should be a fun weekend for everyone, so you should plan to be there!

Pastor's Perspective

Are we being Obedience or being Stubborn?

"Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

If you ask yourself a question concerning the evangelism effort of the Colton Seventh-day Adventist Church in the month of October 2011, what question would you ask? Would you say, "Why is Colton Church doing an evangelistic program?" "Haven't our church done an evangelist program before?" "What kind of spiritual success has the Colton SDA Church had in the past?" "Wouldn't it be a wasting of time and resources or would it be another boring program that probably only our church members would attend and at the end of the program only a few children will get baptized?"

How about seeing the evangelism program of the Colton SDA Church this year, 2011, as an opportunity for our members to say, "This is not about us, Colton SDA Church, but it is about being obedient to the last command of our Lord Jesus Christ as it is stating in Matthew 28: 18-20 above."

Jesus said that all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to him. Could it be that what Jesus is saying that when we go to evangelize our families, neighborhoods, communities, and our cities we are recognizing his authority in heaven and on earth and also that we are demonstrating obedience to his command? If we consider his words carefully and follow them accordingly, we are actually demonstrating to the world that Jesus is the Lord and Savior of your life and mine. John 14: 15-17 says, "If you love me, you will obey what I command. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever— the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you."

Therefore I would like to say this: Our evangelistic effort to evangelize our families, neighborhood, communities, and our cities; is not about us, it is about being obedient to the final words of the Savior just before He ascended to be with the Father. Paul was so determined to become a faithful evangelist as he concluded his service of making disciples for the kingdom of God. He said in 2 Timothy 4:6-8, "For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time has come for my departure. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing."

Ten Commandments Series: Part Four

Having covered in the first four commandments our duties toward God. We now take the second tablet of the law. Dealing with the duties toward our fellow men. (Matt. 22:34-40)

This fifth commandment is written in Exodus 20:12: "Honor thy father and thy mother: that thy days be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee."

Parents stand to their children as the representatives of God. It is logical and fitting that our first man-ward duty should be toward parents. (Eph. 6:1-3)

Another purpose of this commandment is to engender respect for all rightful authority. Such respect begins with the attitude of children toward their parents. In the mind of the child this becomes the basis for respect and obedience owed to those who are legitimately placed in authority over him throughout life.

There is included in the spirit of this commandment the thought that those who are in authority in the home and outside of it should so conduct themselves that they are ever worthy of the respect and obedience of those under them.

Throughout scripture, disobedience to parents is treated as one of the greatest evil. (Rom. 1:30) Obedience on the part of children is reasonable and just. Of all creatures that are born, a human babe is the most helpless, and for years it is entirely dependent on the kindness and love of parents.

But even more important, a child who is disobedient to parents will surely be disobedient to God, for he will know nothing of those disciplines and restraints that are absolutely essential to Christian growth.

The awakening conscience of the child must be respected by the parents: Remember that every training must be "In the Lord."

In the fifth commandment, it is clearly shown both the responsibilities of the child and the parents.

Children are to obey in the Lord, and the parents are to mold or train up a child. (Prov. 22:6) It is our most important duty to train them up right, remembering that this is the only thing that we as parents can take with us to that heavenly home that God is preparing for us.

What a wonderful day will it be. Because of our right training we all can be there. May this be our daily prayer for our whole family to be saved in Christ's kingdom.




